
This Key Stage 2 presentation looks at various percussion sounds, how they are made how they can be manipulated and how the sound reaches your ears. It discusses the physics of sound and how sounds can be used to paint pictures. It will look at how different speeds of vibration produce different pitches and how these sounds can be organised to make music. This presentation can be used at the beginning, middle or end of a Key Stage 2 project on sound. It can be used as a part of your science week or as a freestanding talk. The content and length will vary depending on your schools needs. Much of the content can be arranged around your requirements. If for example you have been working on the ear, this topic can be revised and reinforced to aid learning.


